Evidence Act recognizes statistical agencies as the foundation of data for evidence-building.

Stat agencies need **strengthening**, additional **authorities** to acquire data, and additional **responsibilities**/requirements to provide data. Then the system needs to **scale**.

Be knowledgeable about the issues

☑ Communicate and coordinate across agencies

 $\square$  Seek input from data users

☑ Be innovative to improve accuracy, timeliness, and efficiency



## Credible and Accurate

☑ Regularly evaluate data and products

☑ Publicly describe methods and limitations, including for outside data

Seek new methods and adopt new technologies

Provide dissemination policies and ensure equitable access to publicly disseminated data



☑ Make products available on an equitable, policy-neutral, transparent, timely, and punctual basis.

☑ function in an environment that is clearly separate and autonomous from the other administrative, regulatory, law enforcement, or policy-making activities within their respective Departments

☑ conduct statistical activities autonomously when determining...

- what information to collect
- physical security and information systems security
- methods to apply in their estimation procedures and data analysis
- when and how to store and disseminate their statistical products
- which staff to select to join their agencies



✓ seek to avoid even the appearance that agency design, collection, processing, editing, compilation, storage, analysis, release, and dissemination processes may be manipulated.

✓ select candidates for statistical positions based primarily on their scientific and technical knowledge, credentials, experience, and integrity.

☑ maintain and develop in-house staff who are trained in statistical methodology to properly plan, design, and implement core data collection operations and to accurately analyze their data.



## Protect the Trust of Information Providers

✓ ensure the confidentiality and exclusive statistical use of their responses.

☑ maintain a strong organizational climate that safeguards and protects the integrity and confidentiality of the data

✓ fully adhere to legal requirements and follow best practices for protecting the confidentiality of data

# Congressional Direction: Evidence Act

#### (a) RESPONSIBILITIES.—

- (1) **IN GENERAL.**—Each statistical agency or unit shall—
  - (A) produce and disseminate relevant and timely statistical information;
  - (B) conduct credible and <u>accurate</u> statistical activities;
  - (C) conduct objective statistical activities; and
  - (**D**)protect the trust of information providers by ensuring the <u>confidentiality</u> and exclusive statistical use of their responses.

**(b) SUPPORT FROM OTHER AGENCIES.**—The head of each agency shall <u>enable</u>, <u>support</u>, <u>and</u> <u>facilitate</u> statistical agencies or units in carrying out the responsibilities described in subsection (a)(1).
