Motivation for the Study

- Executive Order on Advancing Racial Equity and Support of Underserved Communities through the Federal Government
 - January 20, 2021
 - Section 7. Promoting Equitable Delivery of Government Benefits and Equitable Opportunities
- NASS is considering adding new content to the 2027 Census of Agriculture
 - Sexual Orientation and Gender Identity (SOGI)
 - Producers with disabilities





Research Questions

- 1. Does the presence of disability questions affect either unit or item response rates?
- 2. Does the presence of sexual orientation and gender identity (SOGI) questions affect either unit or item response rates?
- 3. If both disability and SOGI questions are present, is the effect on unit response rates additive or is some interaction between the sets of questions present?





Experimental Study Design

- 1. Randomized sample of 75,262 Active Farms on Sampling Frame
- 2. Four (4) treatment groups randomly assigned within each stratum
 - Control no test questions added (n =~12,500)
 - Only Disability questions (n =~12,500)
 - Only SOGI questions (n =~ 25,000)
 - Both Disability and SOGI questions (n =~ 25,000)
- 3. SOGI treatment group Split into two (2) <u>subgroups</u>
 - Subgroup 1 confirmation question if their recorded sex at birth differed from their present gender identity
 - Subgroup 2 respondents were not asked the confirmation question

Data Collection

- 1. A four-page questionnaire was used for all treatment groups
- Survey administered December 20, 2021 February 25, 2022
 - Mail, on-line, telephone (CATI)
- 3. Cooperation rate: 45.3% (34,059 returned)





Analysis

- Response: response/no response
- Generalized linear model with a logit link function
- 2² Factorial arrangement of treatments (SOGI and Disability Questions) presence/absence
- Demographic stratum (LGBTQ+, American Indian/Alaskan Native, Asians/Native Hawaiians/Pacific Islanders, Blacks, Hispanics, Females, Others)
- All two- and three-way interactions
- Unweighted analysis—Sample Average Treatment Effects (SATE) estimates





Unit Nonresponse

- Presence disability questions not significant
 - Response rate: 44.5% (±0.3%) when present
 - Response rate: 45.0% (±0.3%) when not present
- Presence of SOGI questions significant
 - Response rate: 43.3% (±0.3%) when present
 - Response rate: 46.3% (±0.3%) when not present
- Demographic stratum significant

Item Response Rates: SOGI Questions

Control: 95.7%

SOGI

- Gender identity: 95.3%
- Sex recorded at birth: 94.6%
- Sexual orientation: 90.3%

Discussion

- Unit response rate
 - Presence of SOGI questions negatively impacted response rates
 - Impact greater within some strata
 - LGBTQ+ stratum: decreased 5.8% when both SOGI and disability questions added
 - Women stratum: decreased 5.3% when SOGI questions added
- Item response rate: SOGI
 - Gender identity question: 95.3%
 - Sexual orientation question: 90.3%
 - Would asking gender identity and sex reported at birth meet the information need?
- Insufficient data for accurate measurement error assessment
- Only respondent reported—what about proxy reporting?
- Strength of the use case for collecting SOGI data?
