# Established Interagency Working Group on Equitable Data (EDWG) to:

- Provide recommendations and identify inadequacies in existing Federal data collection programs
- Recommend strategies for addressing identified deficiencies
- Support agencies in implementing actions that expand and refine the data available to measure equity and diversity
- Initiate the Subcommittee on Equitable Data (SED)

#### **EDWG** Recommendations

- 1 Make disaggregated data the norm while protecting privacy
- Catalyze existing federal government infrastructure to leverage underused data
- Build capacity for **robust equity assessment** for policymaking and program implementation
- Galvanize diverse partnerships across levels of government and the research community
- 5 Be accountable to the American public
