- We have important research and policy questions
  - Equity
  - Return on Investment
  - Prevalence
- Data exists to inform our questions
- Historically, the process to <u>discover</u> and <u>apply</u> for access to those data has been inefficient and, at times, ineffective

# SAP Establishment & Portal Development



The Foundations for Evidence-Based Policymaking Act of 2018 (§ 3583) requires OMB establish a process through which agencies, state, local, and tribal governments, researchers, and individuals may apply to access confidential federal data



Standardized process across statistical agencies



Common application form



Standard review criteria for access determination



Timeframes for prompt determinations



Standards for transparency



An appeals process for adverse decisions

# SAP Development – Phase 2 (2020-2022)

- 16 agencies; 14 access locations
- Expand participation and capabilities from Phase 1
  - Participation from principal statistical agencies and units
  - Included data in the FSRDCs and agency-specific secure data access facilities
- Creation of a <u>policy defining the SAP</u>

# SAP Governance



# SAP Governance Board

- SAP Policy required the establishment of an ICSP subcommittee to serve as the Governance Board for SAP activities
  - Serve as the executive steering committee to oversee the SAP
  - Coordinate the statistical agencies and units accepting SAP applications
- SAP Governance Board is composed of members who have broad knowledge of the federal statistical system
  - ICSP members
  - Representatives from the Evaluation, Privacy, and Chief Data Officer communities

Note: ICSP = Interagency Council on Statistical Policy





#### SAP Governance Board – Working Group Composition

 SAP Governance Board Charter required the creation of three standing working groups

Working Group	Members	Agencies Represented
Budget and Policy	11	9
Communication	11	7
Technical	30	16

 Current working group activities include technical requirements development, SAP communication plan development, and SAP newsletter dissemination



# **SAP Metrics**



### SAP Application Metrics: Applications received

• 449 applications received between Dec 2022 and Sept 2023





#### SAP Application Metrics: Decisions rendered





#### SAP Application Metrics: Review duration

• The average review duration for an approved application is 40 days

Review Duration (as of Sept 15)		
Average review duration	Adherence to review timeframes*	
Average Approval time: 40.86 days	• 156 of 161 applications (97%) had decisions	
Average Rejection time: 51.76 days	rendered within the review timeframe	
<ul> <li>Average Withdrawal time: 11.76 days</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>5 projects exceeded the review timeframe (4 project were between 1-5 days overdue)</li> </ul>	

\*Review timeframes:

- 12 weeks (84 days) for single-agency applications
- 24 weeks (168 days) for multi-agency applications
- Applications requesting data that requires approval from a party outside the SAP (e.g., a foundation or state agency) are exempt from review timelines

# SAP Establishment: Evidence Commission

The Commission on Evidence-Based Policymaking recommended a single process to apply for government data

The Office of Management and Budget should promulgate a single, streamlined process for researchers external to the government to apply, become qualified, and gain approval to access government data that are not publicly available.
